



Pace of Play:
Things a player should do to help

1. Be aware of your position in relation to the group in front. If you keep up with that group, you can't be accused of slow play
2. Don't be concerned about the group behind. That is the officials' responsibility
3. If you are aware your group is falling behind, speak to your fellow-competitor(s) or opponent(s) and make a real effort to catch up
4. Do not wait until it is your turn to play before:
 - putting on your glove
 - calculating your yardage
 - assessing your shot, wind direction etc.
 - selecting your club
 - looking at your line of putt (within the bounds of normal etiquette)
5. Do not delay play by marking your score card if it is your honour
6. Do not hesitate to play a provisional ball if your original ball may be lost outside a water hazard or may be out of bounds.
